### SPEAKER'S NOTES



Judy Emerson spoke this morning about the new Music Education Program being initiated at Rosecrance. This program was the recipient of some of our raffle dollars and it is being

accomplished in collaboration with the Music Academy of Rockford College. "Rosecrance already has art, horticulture, recreation and fitness activities to help youth sustain recovery. Similarly, we believe music can promote recovery as patients learn to understand and process emotions that fostered unhealthy behaviors. We believe music can help them get well and stay well."

She told us of the history of Rosecrance and how it began as one family's dream to help orphaned boys in the early 1900's. It has grown from a home in New Milford (the old Manzullo restaurant) to three facilities. The main campus has one 14 million dollar building on University Drive east of the city which houses 78 people, There are 2/3 boys and 1/3 girls living there. There is a new Monarch Home for girls 15-19 years also on that campus, south of that building, plus one on State Street in Rockford.

When addictions begin, maturity is suspended and age appropriate activities have to be reinstated during the recovery process. They have to remember what they were good at. This pilot music program hopes to address this issue and hopefully present the opportunity through music for lasting recovery.. Rosecrance's new slogan is "Life's Waiting." Isn't that great?
